Foodbank Needs 5,000 Turkeys Donated to Meet Holiday Demands !

Santa Barbara County, CA. - The Foodbank of Santa Barbara County is gearing up to feed thousands of hungry children, seniors, families and individuals during the 2007 holiday season. The activities begin with a county wide Annual Turkey Drive on November 1 through the 20. The Foodbank needs more than 5,000 turkeys to be donated before Thanksgiving as well as monetary and non-perishable food donations.

“Our neighbors go hungry 12 months out of the year, but his time of year we have a special need for food and money,” says Executive Director Jim Mangis, “we can brighten their holidays and provide help through the winter months.”

Mangis wants the community to know that the availability of donated non-perishable foods from major manufacturers has decreased over the year, along with the traditional food sources including allocated food from the USDA. “For every \$1 dollar donated the Foodbank can distribute \$7 dollars of nutritious food. All turkeys and food donated for the holiday is distributed without charge to those in need,” continued Mangis. “All donations are greatly appreciated.”
