Foodbank: Securing the Future

I am honored to serve as board chair again after participating in last year’s progress on key Foodbank strategies:

1. acquiring a new south county warehouse;
2. improving board governance; and
3. supporting the team as they responded to ongoing peak demand driven by the Covid economic crisis and record inflation.

I thank the Board for their service; management and all the team for their hard work; and all those who volunteered and donated this year.

Much remains to be done to make the new facility fit for purpose. The office space is nearly ready for the administrative team to move in this year. We expect to complete design, permitting and begin construction this year on the warehouse, so it can be operational by summer 2023.

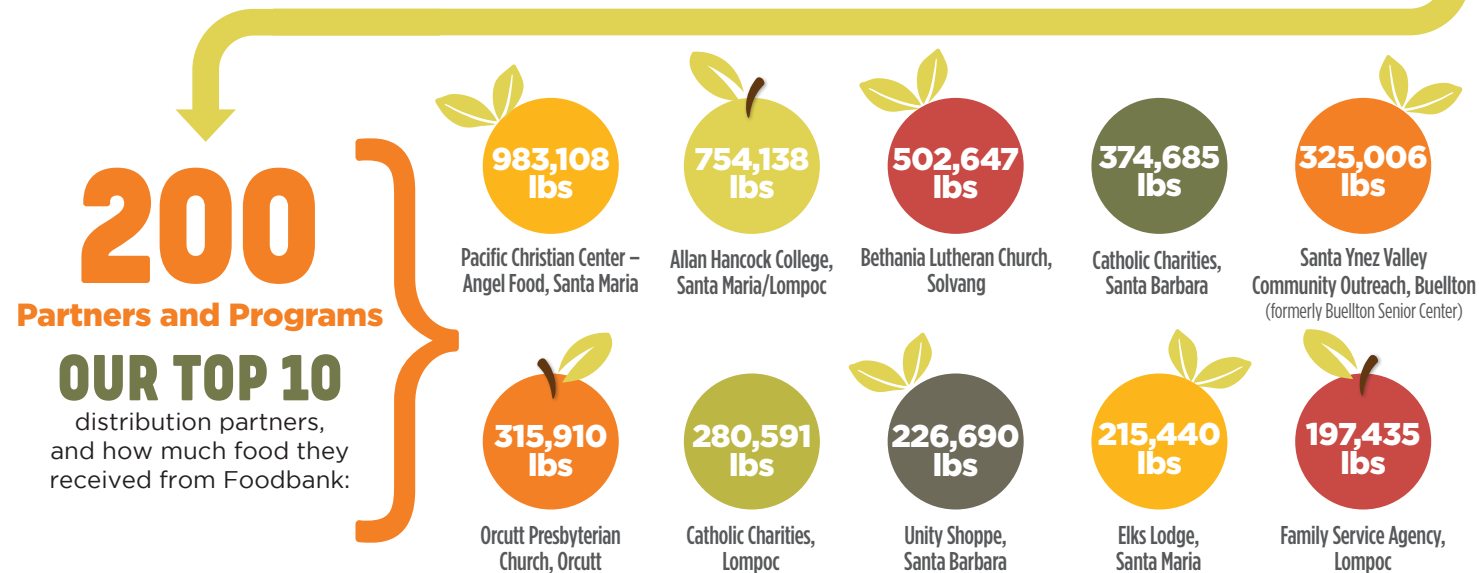

Healthy Farmworkers



Agriculture is a major economic force and a huge quality-of-life boon for all of us in Santa Barbara County.

Ironically, the very community members who plant and harvest locally grown berries, tomatoes, avocados, citrus fruit, fresh greens and more — that the rest of us enjoy year round — often can't afford to feed their own families.

In 2020, we deepened our partnership with Community Health Centers of the Central Coast (CHCCC) to add nutrition education to their decade-long farmworker support initiative, for which the Foodbank has provided fresh produce and healthy groceries.

Facing the Covid-19 crisis, CHCCC and Healthy Farmworkers provided PPE and education that reduced Covid among

farmworkers from 18% to 4% (before vaccines were available).

With the County's Health Education Office, Health Linkages and Promotores, peer-to-peer education developed by our nutrition knowledge team is provided in Spanish and Mixteco. Topics include dietary approaches to lower cholesterol, lower blood sugar and more.

The original programs took place every other month at four sites in Santa Maria. Since then, we've expanded to serve farmworkers every month at 12 housing locations and farms (to eliminate transportation barriers) from Santa Maria to Carpinteria.

Healthy Farmworkers timeline:

Summer 2020:

Formal collaboration with CHCCC launched 4 sites, every other month

Winter 2021-22:

Awarded Boundless Collaboration Grant Feeding America provided \$100,000 for us to collaborate with FOOD Share, Inc. in Ventura County to increase capacity and to source culturally significant foods for farmworkers in both regions.

April 2022: Feeding America Network Values Prize!

Spring 2021: Program doubled 4 sites, every month

Early spring 2022: Program expands to south county 4 farm sites, monthly in Carpinteria

Late spring 2022: 50% increase in locations 4 more sites added at farms in Santa Maria



INTRODUCING THE FOODBANK’S NEW SANTA BARBARA “SHAREHOUSE”!

The Foodbank has long searched for a larger, more efficient facility in south county to respond adequately to food insecurity and ensure disaster resilience.

WHY IS A NEW WAREHOUSE ESSENTIAL?



Lack of space:

- Current warehouse only holds **15% of the food needed**.
- We turn away **32,000 pounds** of fresh produce **each week**.
- Food is currently trucked **72 miles**, handled **8 times** and stored in **4 different places**.



Increased Food Insecurity:

- During the pandemic, **130,000** people received food monthly.
- Inflation is hitting low-income residents hardest, with no end in sight.



Disaster Preparedness:

- If an earthquake or fire shut down Highways 101 and 154, south county would have **no emergency food**.

WHAT IS THE SHAREHOUSE?

Our new south county facility will be more than a warehouse. It will be a **Sharehouse** — a place to share food, education and hope in our community.

Location: 80 Coromar Drive, Goleta

- 57,000-square-foot warehouse and a 20,000-square-foot office building
- Current warehouse is about 10,000 square feet

The new Sharehouse will:

- Cut fuel emissions, reduce food waste and increase food safety.
- Store **750,000+ pounds** of food, making **585,000 meals** available for immediate distribution.
- Enable us to accept 80,000 more pounds of food donations every week.
- Provide space for **1.2 million pounds** of disaster food storage, allowing both north and south county to store more disaster food.
- Feature a **Nutrition Promotion Center** – a central location to develop and improve food literacy for all.

Building purchase: \$9.7 million

(Total price: \$12.7 - \$3 million of Foodbank reserves)

Improvements, construction, equipment: \$8.3 million

Total needed: \$18 million

Funds already raised during the silent phase of the campaign: \$15 million

COMMUNITY EMERGENCY RESPONSE TEAM (CERT) TRAINING

We're proud to further expand disaster readiness across the entire county, not just at the Foodbank, but among our partner agencies and the greater community. We're continuing to offer certification programs for Community Emergency Response Team (CERT). We graduated a cohort of 38 trainees in May 2022, with another training scheduled for October. The Foodbank's disaster specialist Anthony Rodriguez brings formidable expertise in emergency response to the program. Participants from Santa Maria Salvation Army and Housing Authority of Santa Barbara County joined Foodbank staff to be ready to serve in case of large-scale disasters.
